About the Bazm-e-Sukhan

Bazm-e-Sukhan is a celebration of Urdu poetry and literature, curated and conducted by CDPP in collaboration with the Digital Empowerment Foundation through its initiative A-CODE. Established in 2018, the gathering has found its home at Lamakaan, Hyderabad, a space that resonates with dialogue and cultural exchange. Over the years, Bazm-e-Sukhan has evolved into a vibrant forum where people come together to listen, recite, reflect, and engage with the living and ever-expanding tradition of Urdu literary expression.

Alongside its physical presence, Bazm-e-Sukhan has nurtured a global community of over 190 participants who meet every Tuesday on Zoom. These online sessions enable writers, readers, and listeners from across geographies to remain connected to Urdu poetry and prose, fostering an inclusive and intergenerational exchange of ideas, texts, and interpretations.

The in-person sessions at Lamakaan remain the primary anchor of the initiative. Held on the second Wednesday of every month, these gatherings offer a structured yet open forum for readings, discussions, and collective engagement. The format accommodates planned recitations, thematic explorations, and spontaneous conversations, allowing both regular contributors and first-time participants to share the space with equal ease. Together, these sessions reaffirm Bazm-e-Sukhan's commitment to keeping Urdu literature accessible, participatory, and rooted in lived cultural practice.

Our Publications

The Bazm also publishes anthologies that reflect its commitment to literature, translation, and cultural dialogue. Its first publication, *Aata Hai Mujhko Guzra Hua Zamana* (2021), is an iconic account of a life lived in poetry within the police force, authored by retired Director General of Police, Ram Pal Joshi.

Another significant publication is *Alfaaz Ki Mehfil*, a compilation of select Urdu poetry along with English interpretations, authored by Satya Prabhakar, one of the most eminent business leaders in the IT sector. The anthology has seen multiple editions: the first in 2022. In 2024, the Bazm published *Daman-e-Gulchein*, authored by Asrar Ahmed Khan, a collection of Urdu literary works with English translations by Prof. Ali Mir, Prof. Raza Mir, and Dr. Umair Ullah Khan, with a foreword by Ms. Anees Ayesha.

Also in 2024, *Viriah* by Krishna Ghubili was published in Urdu by CDPP. This work was first published in English in 2018 by Nation Press, followed by a Telugu edition published by Anvikshiki in 2020.





The song lyricists of Bombay composed a wide variety of qasawid over the last 80 years, often borrowing from or parodying the popular Urdu verses of the masters like Ghalib, Akbar, Iqbal, and others. While film qasawid are not at the center by which the classic Urdu poetry was made commonplace in South Asia, it is not necessarily an appraisal or 'Sudai' in its character. Their lyrics emerged from devotional to romantic and celebratory to humorous or liberating through song samples in Yousuf's lecture on cinema qasawid.


