WELCOME AND INTRODUCTION BY G. SUDHIR

Development in India follows the ethnic planes, especially, caste and religion. Muslims in India, the second largest religious population of India (172 million persons as per Census of India 2011) and in the largest democracy of the world, are seen as undergoing increased relative underdevelopment and discrimination. Though Muslims in India are differentiated on the bases of sects, language, region and caste, it has been their religious identify, over the recent past, that has been emphasized in everyday political and policy discourse.

However, the important question for a multicultural country like India is how it will be able to manage its diversity and deliver development in qual measures to various groups. The rupture at one ethnic level may open the possibility of ruptures on other scales and levels as well and that may be counterproductive to the unity, integrity, peace, and democracy of the country. This book and the launch seminar on the 10th of June 2021 discusses these issues in the context of India and Telangana State and highlights major issues of concern.

The release of the book will feature a set of short panel discussions where authors will answer key questions on the arguments they have placed.
