# How do Indians spend money? Insights from the long-awaited CE Survey



The Consumption Expenditure Survey 2022-23 in India indicates notable gaps in household spending between rural and urban areas, with urban areas showing 71% higher Monthly Per Capita Expenditure. The survey analyzes spending on both food and non-food items, revealing different patterns in expenditure distribution. However, changes in survey methodology suggest a need for caution when interpreting these findings. The forthcoming final report is expected to offer deeper insights into the socio-economic status and living standards of Indian households.

Global farmer protests, seen recently in India and Europe put a spotlight on the discontent with agricultural policies. European farmers resist climate regulations, aligning with farright parties. #### Citizenship (Amendment) Act rules, 2024 – understanding its origins





# Diversity and Disparities: A Study on Caste, Religion, Gender, and Disability in Higher Education in India




